## CEO Rob Schmitt Named to Becker's 60 CEOs to Know

For the seventh year in a row, Gibson Area Hospital & Health Services (GAHHS) CEO Rob Schmitt has been named among these top 60 rural hospital and health system CEOs to know, one of only two CEOs selected from Illinois. Schmitt, who has more than 30 years of experience in healthcare leadership, is a fellow of both the American College of Healthcare Executives and the Healthcare Financial Management Association.

## CMS 5-Star Rating

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released their annual patient experience ratings for hospitals nationwide. DNV GL's accreditation program, called NIAHO® (National Integrated Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations), involves annual hospital surveys—instead of every three years—and encourages hospitals to openly share information across departments and to discover improvements in clinical workflows and safety protocols.

## Interventional radiology

Gibson Area Hospital now has an interventional radiology department with an expert medical team and state-of-the-art equipment. We offer a wide variety of advanced, minimally invasive vascular and interventional procedures. Some examples of the image-guided procedures we provide for the community are:

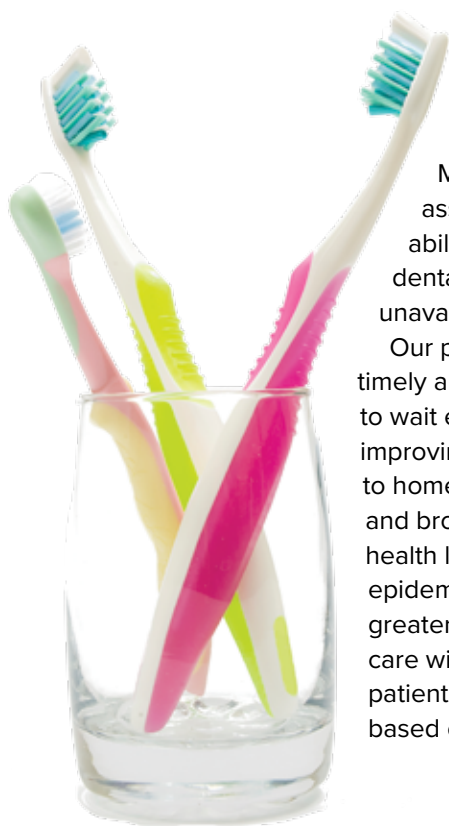
- Treatment of varicose veins, leg swelling, pelvic congestion syndrome, varicoceles, peripheral artery disease and fistulas.
- Stenting, molding and grafting, care for claudication (pain or cramping) and wounds, and uterine artery embolization.
- Placement of Medports, peripherally inserted central catheters and tunneled vascular access catheters.
- Management of joint and back pain with precise injections, kyphoplasty and vertebroplasty.
- Drains, aspirations, superficial biopsies, and biopsies of the chest, abdomen and pelvis.
- Kidney and liver tumor ablation and embolization, feeding tube placement, and kidney tube stents.



## Improving access to dental care

GAH Dental Health continues to offer comprehensive oral care. GAH Dental Health accepts Medicaid and offers financial assistance, based on a patient's ability to pay, in order to offer dental options that are currently unavailable in the area.

Our patients are able to schedule timely appointments without having to wait extended periods of time. By improving access to dental care close to home, we can accelerate progress and broaden efforts to address oral health literacy and help end the epidemic of oral disease—promoting greater integration of oral and primary care with an emphasis on prevention, patient risk assessment, evidence-based care and community health.

## ICAHN's 2019 IMPACT Award

Gibson Area Hospital & Health Services, Gibson City, was awarded the Illinois Critical Access Hospital Network's IMPACT Award for its creation and implementation of a dental clinic.

Area physicians and representatives from its local school system informed Gibson Area Hospital & Health Services' staff of the need for access to dental care. Patients had been on a waiting list for up to six months or were forced to go to the University of Illinois—Chicago for care. In response to this need, GAHHS opened a dental clinic within its facility to provide dental care to those who struggle to find services and those who cannot afford to pay for these services.

"As oral disease affects overall health and well-being, lack of access to dental care had an adverse impact on oral health," said Rob Schmitt, GAHHS CEO. "With our new dental clinic, many of these issues have been alleviated."

# Community service: Free COVID-19 testing

To keep the communities we serve safe, Gibson Area Hospital (GAH) saw a need to provide COVID-19 testing free of charge. From June 24 through Sept. 8, 2020, GAH hosted a free drive-thru COVID-19 test site twice weekly from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. This community service was wildly popular,

with lines stretching to 2 miles outside of town.

The numbers were astounding:

- 6,796 tests were performed at no cost.
- Patients came from 130 ZIP codes in Illinois and from 10 surrounding states.
- GAH was the only hospital in the region to offer rapid testing, with results returned the same day or within 24 hours.

Overall, we started testing in March, with hospital couriers making

regular runs to the IDPH laboratories in Springfield. In June, we started running the Biofire respiratory panel, a multiplex polymerase chain reaction, or PCR, test that allowed the lab to identify multiple viruses, including SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19), in about an hour. We also rolled out rapid antigen testing for the virus at the hospital and our clinics. From March through September, Gibson Area Hospital & Health Services ran 13,557 COVID-19 tests on our patients.





# Necessity is the mother of invention

As the COVID-19 pandemic became a real concern for our organization and community, Gibson Area Hospital's supply chain had to get creative to meet the supply and demand challenges facing us.

Nonsterile, disposable isolation gowns were, and continue to be, in very high demand. After learning how another rural facility found a way to make gowns to supplement the supply chain, we followed suit. We purchased a manual heat-sealing machine, assigned available staff and began production.

We initially began purchasing standard disposable tablecloths from every Dollar General store in our area. With a gown pattern and a few cuts and seam sealing, the result was a homemade nonsterile isolation gown. As we continued to create these gowns, we improved the process, going from a paper pattern to one made of wood.

We also went from using disposable tablecloths to purchasing large black garbage bags in bulk to improve efficiency and reduce cost. By October, we were still making our own nonsterile isolation gowns in an effort to build up our gown supplies from our standard distribution channels. To date, we have made over 10,000 homemade gowns.



## Creating a **safe environment of care**

The COVID-19 pandemic challenged the healthcare industry in an unprecedented way. Gibson Area Hospital & Health Services (GAHHS) met that challenge head-on, with strategic, exhaustive planning and coordinating. An Incident Command Team was immediately organized to identify and execute the daily needs of our organization due to the pandemic. Providing a safe work and care environment was the only priority.

GAHHS followed all health agency (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and Illinois Department of Public Health) guidelines and

regulations at all times—often implementing more stringent guidelines to ensure total protection. Personal protective equipment (PPE) was provided, and we worked tirelessly to ensure that we had enough inventory to meet the needs of our staff and patients.

### **Working around the clock**

Keeping our communities safe was paramount in our call to action. We worked around the clock to provide the most accurate public information available. Gibson Area Hospital helped school districts in the communities we serve procure PPE and supported the

addition of school nurses.

We held free community testing from June through September. When protective gowns became a scarce commodity, we let ingenuity take over and created our own, made right here by our own staff. Our staff and medical professionals worked countless hours to ensure that the healthcare needs of the communities we serve were being met.

Healthcare heroes emerged from all areas of our organization and communities. We are proud to demonstrate genuine care, in the safest possible manner, while combatting the challenges COVID-19 presented.



# Community strong: Healthy lifestyle initiatives make strides

**G**ibson Area Hospital & Health Services (GAHHS) continues to invest in helping our community achieve a healthy lifestyle. Although COVID-19 was the focus of 2020, a healthy lifestyle remains a top priority in our communities, and GAHHS made efforts to keep resources within reach. Here are a few examples:

- GAHHS helped support opioid coalitions in Iroquois, Livingston and Ford counties. There has been work individually and collectively to gather resources to those in need.
- Elite has daily workout videos that range from a Zoom spin class to senior workouts.
- The Paxton Clinic offers hormone therapy with Shelly Warner, NP.
- Although we were unable to host our annual school tours, Safe Sitter® classes or Girls on the Run this year, you can expect to see all these activities as soon as it is safe to resume them.

Everyone at GAHHS is ready to leave the struggles of 2020 behind and take on every opportunity 2021 will have to offer. Expect great things!

there was work to be done to combat the opioid crisis.

The dedication Katherine Austman, MD, has to battling the opioid crisis goes well beyond her own clinic in Gibson City. In January 2020, Dr. Austman began a fellowship at the Saint Louis University School of Medicine. This new venture allowed her to focus on addiction medicine on a much larger scale. Not only did Dr. Austman spend her week in the St. Louis area, she maintained contact with her own clinic, was active with telemedicine and conducted a clinic on Saturdays once a month.

## Opioid coalitions

Iroquois, Livingston and Ford counties continued their meetings throughout the year, via video conferencing to maintain social distancing. The coalitions all strive to eliminate the stigma associated with addiction and provide education and resources to their communities. Law enforcement, educators, healthcare providers and others come together to give valued input on how best to serve, educate

issues. Shelby Warner, APRN, CNM, WHNP-BC, is managing synthetic and bioidentical hormone replacement for women of all ages. Hormone replacement therapy can be used to regulate the menstrual cycle and as an alternative to oral contraceptives, as well as to treat symptoms associated with hormonal imbalance after menopause.

## Geropsychology

Geriatric Behavioral Services provides comprehensive structured treatment for patients aged 65 and older, struggling with one or more mental health challenges. The program combines a safe environment with a unique and effective treatment program for those who need structured, ongoing clinical services. This treatment team, which includes a psychiatrist, therapist, nurse, unit clerk and Daisy the Therapy Dog, provides each patient with an interdisciplinary assessment and an

Meetings are held the second Thursday of each month (except December and January), from 7 to 8 p.m., at the GAHHS Education Center (209 E. 8th St., Gibson City).

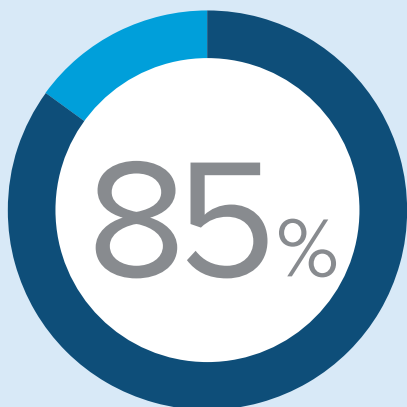

## Auxiliary service: By the numbers

There are 170 Auxiliary members and 30 Junior Auxiliary members.



The Auxiliary made over **700** adult masks and over **500** children's masks for the hospital.

The Needle Craft Committee made approximately **250** baby hats; **40** lap robes, either quilted or sewn; and **40** lap robes that were knitted or crocheted.

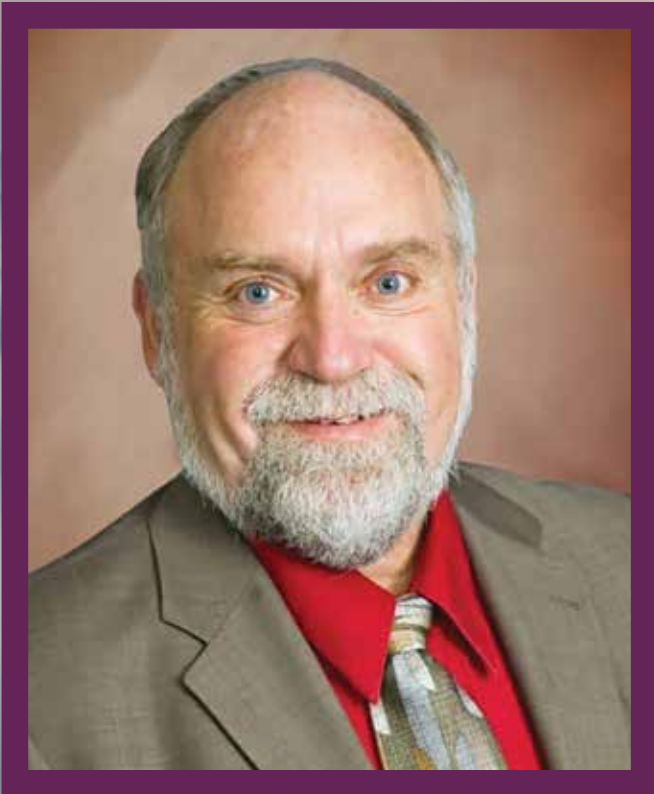

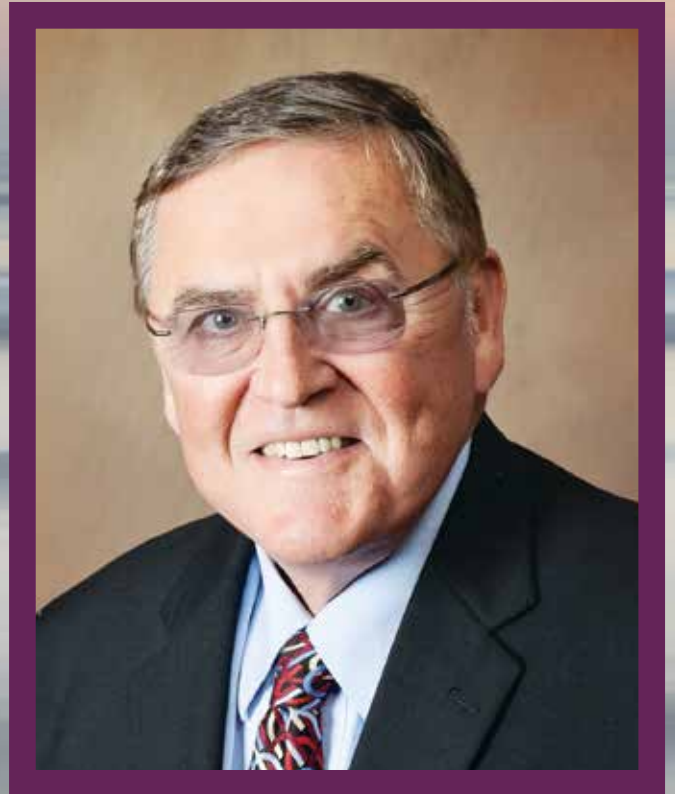
